# **COURSE SYNOPSIS**

# **Department of Music**

# MZK3001 Psychology and Sociology of Music

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the influence of music on men at an individual and group levels. Focus is given to the study on the relationship between music and socio-cultural environment, as well as the impact of music on the values and behaviour of individuals and groups

# MZK3002 Music and Child Development

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the potential of music in fostering child development. This course also emphasizes the approaches in teaching and learning music, musical choice, musical awareness as well as musical aptitude and skill in early childhood education

# MZK3004 Music Critism

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers critical listening skills, evaluation of interpretations, as well as writing skills through the construction of reviews. This includes different approaches in review writing for various music genre

# MZK3005 Jazz Appreciation

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the jazz music, jazz eras such as ragtime, blues, swing, dixieland, bebop, cool jazz, free jazz, fusion, neo-classicism and modern bebop, post modernism era and new wave jazz. The course also focuses on the eight stages of jazz development and main individuals in jazz by this instrument and contributions to jazz culture

# MZK3010 Music Writing Skills

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the principles, format and style used in writing for music. Writing in various forms and presentation are emphasized

# MZK3011 Music Cultures of the World

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite : None

This course covers the diverse music traditions existing in the world and its dynamic relation with a society's culture. Appreciation to various aesthetic values systems embedded in music traditions is emphasized

# MZK3012 Music Heritage of the Country

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the understanding of diverse traditional musics existing in Malaysia. Appreciation to various aesthetic value systems embedded in music traditions is emphasized

# MZK3013 Introduction to Music Therapy

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the role and function of music within the therapeutic context. Focus is given to basic principles and techniques of music therapy according to various populations, the application of music therapy principles and techniques, physical treatment, special needs treatment as well as the personal needs of the music therapist

# MZK3103 Music in Special Education

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the role and function of music in the context of special education through various music therapy and music education approaches. Focus is given to understanding the evolution of historical and social philosophies and principles underpinning special education, basic music techniques according to various population of special needs, as well as experience organizing inclusive music activities within the community

### **MZK3120** Musical Language I

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the understanding of concepts in function harmony using pitch, scales, melodic shape, rhythm, rhythmic divisions, phrasing and harmony. The skills of using simple harmony, basic musical form, modulation, various types of chords, and basic texture are also emphasized

### **MZK3121 Musical Language II**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3120

This course covers the advanced skills in using functional harmony for score reading, choral arrangement, arranging for ensemble and analysis of compositions

### **MZK3123 Basic Composition**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the basic skills in composition which include melody writing, counterpoint and polyphonic design. Composition applying cross cultural musical elements is also emphasized

#### **MZK3124** Orchestration

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers knowledge on characteristics of orchestral instrument and methods of orchestration. Orchestral techniques such as range, tonal characteristics, common usage of instrument and effective instrumental combinations are emphasized

### **MZK3125 Contemporary Music Language**

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers skills in contemporary music arrangement that encompasses jazz harmony, complex rhythms, jazz rhythms and modern rhythms. Advanced aspects of pitch, textures, timbre and contemporary musical forms are also emphasized

### **MZK3203 Performance Practice**

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the detailed study of musical scores from various musical eras and styles as well historical development of music instruments. Comparison between historically informed and modern interpretation are emphasized

### **MZK3212 Twentieth Century and Contemporary Art Music**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the compositional styles and techniques of the twentieth century and contemporary composers, analysis of music score and writing of musical extracts

### **MZK3222** Music Awareness I

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the development of compositional style of the middle ages, Renaissance, Baroque and early classical period. The course also emphasizes the study on the usage of pitch, harmony, texture, timbre, rhythm and forms through the analysis of musical score

### **MZK3223 Music Awareness II**

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3222

This course covers the development of composition style of the classical, romantic, 20th century periods and contemporary. Music analysis from the usage of pitch, harmony, texture, timbre, rhythm and music form by composer from the above eras are emphasized

### **MZK3311** Musicianship I

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers musicianship skills in sight singing, music transcription and keyboard harmony, basic abilities in controlling pitch and rhythm, and harmony

### **MZK3312** Musicianship II

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3311

This course covers the advanced musicianship skills in sight singing, music transcription and keyboard harmony, advanced abilities in controlling pitch and rhythm, and harmony

# MZK3331 Instrumental Solo I

3(1+2)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the performance skills of repertoire in the Baroque or improvisation based genre for the first study including the technical skills, style and the interpretation in that era. Performance in the form of recital are emphasized

# MZK3332 Instrumental Solo II

3(1+2)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3331

This course covers the performance skills of repertoire in the classical era or improvisation based genre for the first study instrument including the technical skills, style and the interpretation in that era. Performance in the form of recital are emphasized

# MZK3333 Instrumental Solo III

3(1+2)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3332

This course covers the performance skills of repertoire in the Romantic era for the first study instrument including the technical skills, style and the interpretation in that era. Performance in the form of recital are emphasized

## MZK3334 Instrumental Solo IV

3(1+2)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3333

This course covers the performance skills of repertoire from the twentieth century until the contemporary era or repertoire of experimental and cross genre music for the first study instrument including the technical skills, style and the interpretation in that era. Performance in the form of recital are emphasized

# MZK3335 Instrumental Solo V

3(1+2)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3334

This course covers the advanced performance skills of repertoire in the 20<sup>th</sup> century's, experimental or cross genre music for the first study instrument including the technical skills, style and the interpretation in that era. Performance in the form of recital is emphasized

# MZK3425 Orchestra I

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

Kursus ini merangkum kemahiran asas persembahan orkestra berasaskan repertoir asas yang ditetapkan. Kebolehan dalam menguasai bahagian instrumental tertentu secara individu, bermain secara berkumpulan dan bekerja secara berpasukan diberikan penekanan.

This course covers the fundamental skills in orchestra performance based on identified fundamental repertoire. Abilities in mastering the designated instrumental part independently, performing in a group setting and working as a team are emphasized

# MZK3426 Orchestra II

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3425

This course covers the advanced skills in performing the orchestra based on identified repertoire at a moderate level. Abilities in mastering the designated instrumental part independently, performing in a group setting and working as a team are emphasized

# MZK3427 Orchestra III

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3426

This course covers the skills in orchestra performance based on identified repertoire at an advanced level. Abilities in mastering the designated instrumental part independently, performing in a group setting and working as a team are emphasized

# MZK3428 Orchestra IV

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3427

This course covers the skills in performing the orchestra based on identified repertoire at a high level. Abilities in mastering the designated instrumental part independently, performing in a group setting and working as a team are emphasized

**MZK3436** Choir I 3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the fundamental skills in choir singing based on identified repertoire. Emphasis is given to the abilities in mastering the designated vocal part independently and performing in group

MZK3437 Choir II 3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3436

This course covers the advanced skills in performing choir based on identified repertoire at a moderate level. Abilities in mastering the designated vocal part independently, performing in group and working as a team are emphasized

**MZK3438** Choir III 3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3437

Kursus ini merangkum kemahiran lanjutan dalam memberi persembahan koir berasaskan repertoir yang ditetapkan dalam era Romantik. Kebolehan dalam menguasai bahagian suara yang ditetapkan secara berdikari, menyanyi secara kumpulan dan bekerja berpasukan adalah ditekankan

This course covers the advanced skills in performing choir based on identified repertoire in the Romantic era. Abilities in mastering the designated vocal part independently, performing in group and working as a team are emphasized

**MZK3439** Choir IV 3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3438

This course covers the advanced skills in choir singing based on identified repertoire at a high level. Abilities in mastering the designated vocal part independently, performing in group and working as a team are emphasized

MZK3441 Ensemble Performance I 3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the basic technique and performance skills of chamber music or improvisation-based ensemble music. The course also emphasizes the interpretation of chamber music repertoire

MZK3442 Ensemble Performance II 3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3441

This course covers the technique and performance skills of chamber music for repertoire at a middle level. The course also emphasizes the interpretation of chamber music repertoire

MZK3443 Ensemble Performance III 3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3442

This course covers the advance level of technique and performance skills in ensemble music. The course also emphasizes on the interpretation of chamber music repertoire

MZK3444 Ensemble Performance IV 3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: MZK3443

This course covers the high level technique and performance skills in ensemble music for the chosen repertoire. The course also emphasizes on the interpretation of chamber music repertoire

MZK3605 Studio Recording Techniques 3(1+2)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the microphone techniques, synchronization, audio production console, signal processors, noise reduction, product manufacture and studio session procedures

MZK3610 Introduction to Music Technology 3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the basic knowledge of musical tone generation and radiation, the history of technology in music, music synthesis, musical instruments digital interface (MIDI), sound reinforcement and sound recording

MZK3611 Audio System 3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the usage of various types of audio systems, signal flow, amplification, microphones, mixers, signal processors, power amplifiers and loudspeakers

### **MZK3713 MIDI and Digital Audio Theory**

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers basic MIDI theory, MIDI hardware and software. The course also focuses on control, synchronization, junctions and routings, MIDI slaves, basic digital audio theory, digital sampling systems, digital audio recording, audio compression schemes, various audio software, and combining digital audio and **MIDI** 

#### **MZK3714 Sequencing Software**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the skills in using computer software for composition and orchestration. Usage of various computer programs, uses of MIDI software and the role of VSTi's for the development of sequences in composition are emphasized

### **MZK3715 Desktop Music Publishing**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the development of skills in using professional music notation and sound analytical software for score production, orchestration, and audio preservation. This course also focuses on score processing skills, creating automatic piano reductions from orchestral scores, creating audio data documents and creating audio data base entries

### MZK3804 **Teaching of Practical Music**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the methods of teaching music in individual and group setting. Problems in group music teaching and solutions to overcome it are emphasized

### MZK3901 **Music Industry**

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the introduction of various careers related to music, laws related to musical output, various types of contract and marketing of music. Various other careers related to the music industry, and the relationship between music with other related sectors will also be emphasized

#### MZK3902 **Music Management**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the basic training in music management and administration through the production of live concerts. Preparation and organization of a variety of different concerts and evaluation of the production plan for the live concert are emphasized

### **MZK4300 Introduction to Jazz Improvisation**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

Kursus ini merangkum pemahaman pelbagai gaya improvisasi muzik jaz. Kemahiran bermain lagu jaz dengan gaya improvisasi juga ditekankan.

This course covers the understanding scales, regular and irregular time, basic jazz riffs and basic patterns in jazz standards, beloop styles, contemporary styles and improvisation in beloop, blues, modal and free jazz

### **MZK4401 Conducting Technique**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the conducting techniques, score interpretation and leadership in conducting music ensemble

### **MZK4800** Research in Music

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the types of resources, topics, concepts and approaches used in research in music. Writing of research proposal are emphasized

### **MZK4903 Industrial Training**

6(0+6)

Pre-Requisite: Lecturer's Approval

In this course, students will be exposed to real working environment in industries/organizations. Training includes application of the theoretical and practical aspects that have been studied with current practices in the workplace. Problem solving and communication skills are also emphasized

# MZK4949 Bachelor Project

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the aspects of planning and executing project. These include title selection, conducting critical review, designing and performing work strategy, collecting and analysing data, documenting and presenting project output

# MZK4959 Bachelor Dissertation

6(0+6)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the preparation of proposal, implementation and scientific writing of research project. Scientific approach to generate data systematically through appropriate design, data collection and analysis are emphasized

# MZK4991 Lecture Recital

3(0+3)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the skill training in presenting lecture recitals based on individual's music specialization. The lecture recital discusses types of repertoire chosen as well as background and justification on the instrument used

6(0+6)

# **Department of Government and Civilisation Studies**

# FEM3301 Ethics and Values in Development

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the introduction of concept and philosophy of ethics, moral and development, comparison of theories of development, positions and roles of moral and ethics, balanced and intergrated physical, human, social and spiritual development.

# **FEM3401** Introduction to Politics

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the concept and basic theory of politics, the system and structure of politics of a state, and public administration. This course also focuses on political culture, political economy, politics and society, politics and security, system and international relations; as well as discusses current political issues

# FEM3402 Introduction to Philosophy

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the history, development, basic concepts, the function of philosophy, major scholl of thaughts, important figures and their main ideas. The primary focus involves the important components of philosophy and its relation with other discipline.

# FEM3403 Social Conflict in Plural Society

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the concepts and theories of social conflict, forms of conflict, and communal conflicts in Southeast Asia. Social conflict and national integration, strategies of conflict reduction as well as social conflict in Malaysia are also discussed.

# FEM3404 Thinking and Reasoning

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers how to think creatively and critically which involve analyzing and synthesising information. The course focuses on the aspects of the construction of arguments and problem solving pattern formation.

# FEM4401 Politics and Development

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers on process of changes in politics and development. The discussion involve the changes from the perspective of theory and current issue at global and local level

# FEM4402 Political Sociology

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the elements which are related to the society and politics in terms of power, ideology and the process of political socialization. The course focuses on the theories and basic concepts of political sociology in order to assist students in analyzing the current issues of Malaysian politics.

# FEM4403 Southeast Asian Politics

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the aspects of state history of the Southeast Asian region, colonialism and imperialism, independence movements, the emergence of new elites and political change. Ideology, political system, conflict and political stability, external influences, foreign policy, collective security and ASEAN are also discussed.

# SKP2101 Malaysian Nationhood

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the nation's history, governments' system and organization as well as national policies. This course also discusses the process of nation building and the significance of patriotism

# SKP2203 Islamic Civilisation and Asian Civilisation

2(2+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the civilisation studies in building Malaysian society based on civilisation principles in practicing mutual respect and social interaction within multi racial society. Civilisation studies also play a crucial role in building Malaysian civilisation in order for the society become more alert on civilisational issues

SKP2204 Ethnic Relations 2(2+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the background of ethnic relation in Malaysia and the basic concepts as well as theories in ethnic relations. The influence and role of economy, constitution, politics, religion and education towards ethnic relation and efforts of various parties towards social cohesion are also emphasized

# **Department of Human Development and Family Studies**

# FEM3001 Introduction to Human Development

Pre-Requisite : None

This course encompasses the life-span development of an individual as God-created being which includes moral values, nature, potential and individual resiliency. The ecological contexts of individuals, family, and community in handling current and future issues and challenges are also discussed

# FEM3003 Research Method

3(3+0)

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the fundamental philosophy of research, basic concepts of research, its purposes and importance, and application of quantitative and qualitative techniques in research proposal. This course focuses on steps in research proposals preparation and the importance of ethics in the preparation of research report

### FEM3004 Social Science Statistic

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers social science data descriptive, random variables, sampling distributions, point estimations, confidence intervals and hypothesis testing. The analysis of parametric and non parametric are also discussed

# FEM3101 Developmental Psychology: Children and Adolescents

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the processes of physical, cognitive, social and emotional growth and development from conception through adolescence. Major aspects of each stage of development including the processes and outcomes of interaction between the child and adolescent and the environment are also emphasized

# FEM3102 Developmental Psychology: Adult and Ageing

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the analysis of adult development and ageing from a life span perspective. Basic developmental processes, interaction and transaction of the basic processes in socio-cultural contexts are also discussed

# FEM3104 Work Ecology and Human Development

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers social and psychological aspects of works including work attitude, behaviour, emotions, motivation, work morale, health and safety, worker's wellbeing and leadership in the organisation. Emphasis is also given to determinant of job satisfaction, job performance and productivity

# FEM3105 Stress and Coping

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the examination of stress and coping among individuals. Stressors across the lifespan in various contexts, factors affecting stress levels, coping resources and strategies, holistic stress management technique, measurements of stress and coping and analysis of prevention programs related to stress reduction are also emphasized

# FEM3106 Social Policy and Law

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite : None

This course covers the formation and implementation of social policy in Malaysian context of social welfare and justice. The legal and judiciary's systems responses are also emphasized

# FEM3107 Basic Advising and Counselling

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the applications of theories, skills and techniques on individual and group counselling. Emphasis is given on counselling philosophy, principles and ethics as well as skills to work on different facets of individual's life and various populations. Communication skills, problem identification, goals development and problem solving strategy are also discussed

# FEM3109 Family Ecology and Parenting

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the family as a system, family life course, internal dynamic family and parenting. Challenges and issues according to developmental stages will be discussed.

## **FEM4101** Motivation and Human Achievement

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers various motivation theories, pinciples and processes of achievement, as well as the relationship between emotion, motivation and behavior which leads to human achievement. The application of motivation theories in explaining human achievement are also discussed

# FEM4103 Psychology of Social and Interpersonal Behaviour

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the analysis of social and interpersonal behaviour from the perspective psychology. The influence of social and interpersonal relationships and the application of social psychology and interpersonal skills in human interaction are also discussed

# FEM4104 Psychopathology of Children and Family

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the analysis of abnormal behaviour of the child and family with emphasis on its causes, consequences and treatment. Focus is also given to the role of individual, family and society in assisting individuals with psychopathological problems

# FEM4113 Career Guidance and Advising

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the analysis of career development theories, factors influencing career choice, the career planning process and career satisfaction. Strategies for career information search and planning of career guidance programs are also discussed

# FEM4115 Marriage and Family Advising

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the application of principles, approaches and techniques in marriage and family advising. Emphasis is given to the methods of helping couple and family that need advising and guidance

# FEM4123 Child and Family Advocacy

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the acknowledgement of issues pertaining to child abuse and neglect, delinquent juvenile, child labor, child abduction and domestic violence. Strategies and multi-discipline approaches used by various parties dealing with children and family advocacy are also emphasized

# FEM4130 Curriculum in Early Childhood Programme

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the examination and evaluation of various teaching techniques based on the principles and philosophy of the curriculum for children. The planning and developing curriculum appropriate to children's developmental stages, training in curriculum development, schedules and preparation of teaching aid and involvement in children's teaching and learning activities are also discussed

# FEM4132 Planning and Administration of Early Childhood Programmes

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the development of early childhood programmes with emphasis on the establishment of the programme, staff development, philosophy and goals, administration and management of the programme. Emphasis is also given to the organization, physical environment, menu planning as well as children's nutritional needs, children's safety and health in planning the programme

# FEM4133 Assessment of Child Development

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the utilization of instruments for assessment and measurement from the child development perspective, including observation, formal and informal assessment. Ethical issues in the interpretation of assessment data and the use of a particular instruments are also discussed

# FEM4136 Family Law

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the formation and dissolution of marriage of Muslim and non-Muslim in the Malaysian context. The legality and procedural aspects of marriage and divorce; ancillary claims after divorce; guardianship, custody, and maintenance of children are also emphasized.

# **Department of Resource Management and Consumer Studies**

# FEM3201 Management and Decision Making

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the concepts, processes, and techniques of management and decision making in the utilisation of human and non human resources from an ecosystem perspective. Emphasis is given to the development of human potential resources and decision making skills towards self-excellence

# FEM3202 Nutrition, Health and Environment

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the principles of nutrition and their interrelationship of health and environment in the context of healthy lifestyle, development impact, socio-culture factor, physical environment, diseases and ways to avoid disease. The importance of sustainable development in the prevention and control of nutritional problem, health and environment is also emphasized

# FEM3205 Development of Family Enterprise

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasses the concept and important issues in family enterprise development. All domains of family enterprise development, innovation and creativity activities are emphasised

# FEM4204 Human Capital and Economy

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the concepts and theories from various perspectives of human capital investment. Emphasis is given on the measurement of development and investment of human capital from the classical and neo-classical economics approaches, including the theories of household production, time theory, altruism and grant economy

# FEM4205 Resource Management in Changing Environment

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers factors that drive changes and impacts to individual, family, organization and society. Various theories of change, process and management of change are also discussed

# FEM4225 Labour Law and Employees' Protection

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the laws on employment, trade unions and industrial relations, contractual relationship between employers and employees and collective relationship between employers and trade unions. Issues on contract of employment, terms and conditions of service, employees misconduct, dismissal, remedies and industrial dispute and resolution are also discussed

# **PSP3000** Family and Consumer Economics

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the relevant economic principle and theory and its application to individuals/family as consumers and producers. The impact of economic, psycho-social, political, environmental factors, government economics policy and marketing practices on the wellbeing of the family and consumer are also discussed.

# **PSP3001** Introduction to Consumer Sciences

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite : None

This course encompasses the interrelationships and interaction on roles of consumer, marketer/retailer and government in order to enhance consumer wellbeing. Major concepts including consumers' basic and secondary needs, sustainable development and civilized society toward achieving quality in life as well as the influence and interrelations of systems in the market are emphasised

# PSP3002 Research Methods in Consumer Sciences

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the entire process of conducting research ranging from design to writing research reports. Focus on the research philosophy, process and application in the field of consumer science

# PSP3003 Consumer Psychology

Pre-Requisite: PSP3001

This course encompasses consumer psychology in the context of creating sustainable and ethical consumers. The concept and psychological aspects that affect various processes starting from the acquisition to disposal stages of consumer behavior will be discussed

# PSP3101 Analysis of the Managerial Problems in the Community

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers identification of managerial problems and crisis faced by systems in the community including individuals, family and organisation. Analysis on the causal factors, potential and the weakness of the management and strategic management to overcome problems faced by those systems are also discussed

# PSP3201 Consumer Behavior

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: PSP 3000 or PSP 3001

This course encompasses the concepts and approaches related to consumer behaviour which are discussed through economic, social and psychological approaches. Emphasis is also given on the consumers' decision making process and the current issues related to consumer behavior

## PSP3202 Consumer Protection

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: PSP 3001

This course covers the concept, policy and program in consumer protection. Relationship between the role of consumers, society, government, non-government agencies and businesses as well as consumer protection issues are discussed

# **PSP3203** Consumer Economics

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasses the relevant economic principle and theory and its application to individual as consumers in marketplace. The impact of economic, social, political, environmental factors, government policy and marketing practices on the wellbeing of the consumers are also discussed

# **PSP3204** Family Economics

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasses analyses of the economic function and goal of a family/household and the application of economic theory to explain rational choice of family/household behavior across life course. Emphasis is given on the analysis of the impact of family/household economic decision on the wellbeing of its members as well as future generation and the influence of public policies on family behaviors

# PSP3205 Organisational Behaviour and Decision Making

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the aspect of organization management focusing on behaviour, structures and decision making process within the organizations. The course also focuses on the aspects of interrelationship between the effects of behaviour and decision making process towards effectiveness and efficiency of organisations

# PSP3301 Household Financial Management

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite : None

The course covers the topic on the importance of household financial planning, managing income and expenditure. Focus is also given on the analysis of household financial problems and skills in consumption credits choices, savings, investments and household risks management based on conventional and Islamic systems

# PSP3402 Housing and Human Settlement

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasses the housing issues related to the individual, family, community and factors influencing human settlement which include sosio-cultural, economic, politic psychological, technological and environment. Current consumer housing needs, problems, and policies, roles of government and non-government agencies in providing housing needs in Malaysia are also emphasised

### PSP3504 **Design and Consumer Environment**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the elements and principles of design related to basic human needs. Application and appreciation of elements and principles of design in conservation and preservation of the environment are discussed. Emphasis is also given on aesthetic values, production process, natural environment and manmade design

### **PSP4000 Seminar on Consumer Sciences**

1(0+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasses the discussion and analysis on current consumer issues

### **PSP4200 Consumer and Business Ethics**

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: PSP3201

The course encompasses the introduction to the concepts and principles of consumers and business ethics and also the roles of ethics in achieving market fairness. Studies on deception in the market are discussed from the economic, social, culture, religion, laws and environmental protection perspectives

#### **PSP4201 Consumer Law**

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: PSP3202

This course encompasses the definition and background on the laws of consumer protection in Malaysia. Detailed evaluation on the laws related to various consumer issues including advertisement, trade description, housing, food safety, product liability, direct selling, hire-purchase, consumer credit, e-commerce and the environment is also discussed

### **PSP4202 Consumer Empowerment**

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasses the concepts and model of consumer empowerment and indentifies the roles of individual, seller/manufacturer, government and consumer education in empowering consumers. Assessment of consumer empowerment level among Malaysian is also emphasized

### **PSP4203 Analysis of Consumer Policies and Programmes**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasses the concept and the need to have a comprehensive consumer policy to ensure that the interests of consumers are protected. Emphasis is given on the technique of policy and programme evaluation and comparison of consumer policy at international level

#### PSP4204 **Conflict Management**

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: PSP3205

This course covers the concept and method in conflict management, and it's important from organizational perspective. The course focuses elements that cause conflict, conflict solutions, management function, avoiding and dealing with conflict, and the important of conflict management, method of conflict solutions, mediator roles and effective communication

### **PSP4205** Social Audit and Consumer Well Being

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the understanding of the concepts, principles, processes and measurement in social audit. Case studies and comprisons of audit social implemented in various sectors are also discussed

### **PSP4206 Consumer Advocacy**

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasses the topics on relevant background on advocacy and elaborating in detail the method and techniques required in advocacy. The comparative methods of consumer advocacy in environment, product safety, finance, housing, food, and health is also emphasised

### **PSP4302 Financial Advising**

3(1+2)

Pre-Requisite: PSP3301

This course encompasses the analysis of financial management practices and problems at various income levels and different stages of the family life. Financial management techniques and strategies besides the use of application of counseling techniques in solving family financial problems and helping the individual/family financial management are also emphasised

# PSP4305 The Psychology of Money

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasses the psychological approach in understanding the role of money in individuals and families life. Emphasis is given to impact of money value towards money behaviour and the development of money values, attitude and behaviour among children and adolescent through socialization process. Analysis of financial management practices and problems at various income levels and different stages of the family life and factors affecting the practices is also discussed

# **PSP4306** Retirement and Estate Planning

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: PSP3301

This course encompasses the holistic approaches of estate and retirement planning including the importance of planning for estate and retirement, programs, regulations and laws pertaining to estate and retirement, taxation and will of estate

## PSP4307 Zakat and Individual Taxation

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasess the policy, laws and regulations related to tax and zakat. Comparison between tax and zakat services system and calculation of tax and zakat among various groups of tax payers in the society are also discussed

# PSP4308 Family Risk Management

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: PSP3301

This course encompasses the types of risks, impact of risk on family well being and comparison of strategies on family risk management in the market from conventional and Islamic systems. Evaluation of needs and development of family risk protection plan is also emphasised

# PSP4309 Consumer Saving and Investment

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: PSP3301

This course encompasses the theory, model and principle of saving and family investment. Emphasise is given on the evaluation of suitability of saving and investment products with the financial situation of the family. Analysis of saving behaviour and family investment and factors influencing financial behaviour is also emphasised

# PSP4310 Consumer Credit and Debt Management

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: PSP3301

This course encompasses the types and sources of consumer credit in the market including rules and laws of credit. Steps in credit management and the effect of credit and loans on the well being of the family are also discussed

# **PSP4311** Consumer and Financial Markets

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

The course covers the topic about the various financial systems in the market (conventional and Islamic, also locally and globally) with emphasise on the operation, regulation and laws, roles of institution and enforcement in the market. Analysis of impact of financial policies and programmes on consumer well being is also emphasised

# PSP4401 Environmental Psychology

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasses on the analysis of transactions between individual and physical settings surrounding them. It includes research and practices aimed at making building more human friendly and improving human relationship with the environment

# **PSP4403** Housing Economics

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course encompasses the principle and theory of micro and macro economics and its application to housing and consumer. Inter-relationship between housing market and consumer affordability as well as the implication of housing economics and market practices on the wellbeing of consumer is also emphasised

# PSP4601 Evaluation of Consumer Products and Services

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the concept of quality, characteristics of quality and standardization for consumer products and services. Emphasis is given to the process of decision making, method and process of product evaluation, and also measurement of service quality scientifically

# PSP4602 Product Safety

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the concept of hazard, acts and standards related to consumer protection and product safety as well as the roles of consumers, government, non-government agencies and manufacturers in product safety matters. Emphasis is also given on product safety characteristics, testing techniques, management of product recall and case studies

# PSP4604 Ergonomics and Consumer

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: PSP3504

This course encompasses the concept and principle of ergonomics as well as application in product design. Measurement techniques, evaluation method and process of product design are also emphasized

## PSP4701 Consumer Food Evaluation

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: PSP4601

This course encompasses the principles and practices of consumer food evaluation for market research, consumer food product development, quality control and consumer food selection and acceptance. A practical approach using food evaluation method and statistical procedures are also used to analyze research results and consumer food acceptance

# PSP4702 Food Management

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: FEM3202

This course covers the management function related to operational, marketing and managerial aspects of consumer food service. Emphasis is given on decision making in food purchasing, storage, preparation, cost calculation and price

# PSP4703 Food Quality and Safety

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: FEM3202

This course encompasses the principles of food quality and safety and its role in prevention of food-borne disease. Emphasis is also given on quality and safe food handling practices during purchasing, receiving, storage, preparation, and food service

# PSP4903 Industrial Training

6(0+6)

Pre-Requisite: Lecturer's Approval

In this course, students will be exposed to real working environment in industries/organizations. Training includes application of the theoretical and practical aspects that have been studied with current practices in the workplace. Problem solving and communication skills are also emphasized

# PSP4959 Bachelor Dissertation

6(0+6)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the preparation of proposal, implementation and scientific writing of research project. Scientific approach to generate data systematically through appropriate design, data collection and analysis are emphasised

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# **Department of Social and Development Sciences**

# FEM3302 E-community and Sustainable Community

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the concept and features of conventional community and e-community. The relationship between e-community and sustainable community and e-community as a medium for empowering the community in the information technology era are also discussed.

# FEM3303 Programme Planning and Evaluation

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the meaning of development, principles of development planning and programme evaluation. The course also focuses on the relationship between technology, environment and development planning in achieving better quality in life. Indicators of human development, governance and national development policies as well as issues in planning and evaluating development programmes are also discussed

### FEM3311 Social Problems

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the sociological approaches to the study of social problems. The course also focuses on problems at global, societal, family and individual level. The impact of public policy on social problems and programmes as well as strategies in handling social problems are also discussed

# FEM3312 Social Demography

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the main elements of demography such as size, composition and distribution of population. The course also focuses on the importance of changing factors in influencing the dynamic of the main elements of demography and the effects of the demographic factors on people's well being

# FEM3313 Sociology and Social Anthropology

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers sociological and anthropological perspectives in understanding the dialectic between self (individual) and society. Focus on the history of the major paradigms and prominent scholars with their concepts in sociology and anthropology, their applications in interpreting social phenomena, methodological issues, and the significance of sociological and anthropological perspectives in understanding society and culture

# FEM3331 Introduction to Community Development

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the basic concepts of community development, principles, values, philosophy, community development goals, approaches and types of community development. It also covers role of community workers and community development implementing agencies

# FEM3334 Community Development Leadership

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the leadership theories and models in community development, types and functions of community development leadership, as well as strategies of leadership in community development. This course focuses on issues of leadership in community development

# FEM3335 Development and Sustainability

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the aspects and dimensions of sustainable development, development practice and a critical analysis of the various interpretations of sustainability. Measurement of sustainability, use of indicators, planning techniques, participatory approach, the role of stakeholders and the obstacles to sustainability are also discussed

# FEM3341 Social Work Theory and Practice

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the principle, concept and core value in social work practice. Social policy and law, social work from ecological perspective, needs and application of theory, intervention model, generic social work practice and practice with specific groups are also discussed

# FEM3342 Social Work and Social Welfare

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the development, structure and function of the social welfare institutions. The relationship between social welfare with social work as well as other supporting profesions, social problems, social welfare services, social welfare programmes and its impact on society are also discussed

# FEM3343 Social Work and Human Services

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers professional concept in social work and human services. Social work roles and practices as a response to social issues and the importance of knowledge, skills and values in social work profession are also discussed

# FEM4311 Social Change

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the universal phenomenon in social change, meaning of social change, sources of change, and social change theories. Pattern and duration of change, reactions to change, impact of change and planning of change are also discussed

# FEM4312 Society, Development and Environment

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the discussion on the importance of a balanced treatment to the components of bureaucracy, development programmes and the environment in bringing about social change. The environmental well-being in development initiatives are also emphasised

# FEM4314 Social Policy and Planning

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the definitions, theories, and relationship between social policy and social planning in national development. The planning process, the organization and delivery of social services as well as the use of social indicators are also elaborated

# FEM4331 Community Work and Volunteerism

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the concepts, needs, objectives and models of community work and volunteerism in community development. The planning, implementation and evaluation of community work programmes are also emphasized

# FEM4341 Social Work With Individual and Group

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers discussion on the social work intervention process with individuals and group. It also focusses on the need of knowledge and skill in practice and the role of social worker. Basis of helping relationship in practice with individual and group are also discussed

# FEM4342 Social Work Services

3(2+1)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers various services in social work such as health, education, public welfare, family and child welfare. This course focuses on correctional services, older people, drug abuse, special groups, minority groups and rural areas

# SKP3109 Urban Development

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the history, theories, planning policies and the process of urban development in the Third World Countries. Emphasis is also given on the urban issues using existing cities

# SKP3501 Social Psychology

3(3+0)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers ways human being influence and being influenced by other's people thinking, feelings, and behaviour. This course focuses on the interaction between individuals, between individuals and groups, and between groups.

# FEM4903 Industrial Training

6(0+6)

Pre-Requisite: Lecturer's Approval

In this course, students will be exposed to real working environment in industries/organizations. Training includes application of the theoretical and practical aspects that have been studied with current practices in the workplace. Problem solving and communication skills are also emphasized

# FEM4959 Bachelor Dissertation

6(0+6)

Pre-Requisite: None

This course covers the preparation of proposal, implementation and scientific writing of research project. Scientific approach to generate data systematically through appropriate design, data collection and analysis are emphasized
