COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course focuses on the ideology and politics of Indonesia. It covers the concept of ideology of Pancasila, Function of Pancasila, History of Pancasila, Challenges of Pancasila, Maintaining Pancasila, Indonesia Politics System, Democracy in Indonesia, Political Parties in Indonesia, General Election, and Democracy in Bali. The topics given in this course are designed for the basic introduction of ideology and political of Indonesia. The students are expected to understand the ideology and the political condition in Indonesia.

OBJECTIVES

By the end of this course, the students should be able:

- To understand the concept of ideology of Pancasila
- To describe the five principles of Pancasila
- To understand the history of Ideological struggle in Indonesia's Politics
- To understand the political system in Indonesia
